What Is SCAN?

SCAN is an acronym of Survey of Challenges in Access to Diagnostics and Treatment for NET Patients. INCA, together with its 26 member organisations across 6 continents invites NET patients and healthcare professionals to SCAN the challenges in NET diagnostics, treatments and care. This is going to be the biggest effort released up until now in the NET patient community to globally assess the healthcare systems in terms of provision of care to NET patients.

SCAN Goals

This is not just another survey. For the first time, **SCAN** is going to measure the out-ofpocket costs of diagnosis, treatments and on-going monitoring of NETs on a global scale. SCAN aims to collect robust data reflective of the NET patients' experience by geographical areas covering Africa, Asia, Oceania, North and South America. With the ambitious goal of collecting responses from all parts of the world, both from NET patients and healthcare professionals, we rely on you to spread the word about SCAN.

Why Is INCA Doing SCAN?

Why another survey?

Each survey paints a picture of the current situation, and we live in a dynamic and constantly changing world – new medical possibilities emerge, requirements and needs change. In order to bridge existing gaps and improve patient outcomes, we must have up-to-date and reliable information.

What makes SCAN special?
