

UKINETS Sub-committee Remits

Programme Organising

- Contribute to the development of the scientific programme for the Annual Conference of the Society within the agreed budget, suggesting potential topics, speakers and chairs, taking into consideration the suggestions of the UKINETS membership and inviting speakers and sessions chairs as required
- Evaluate submitted abstracts within the specified timeframe and using the specified criteria and framework

Publicity & Media

- Raise the society's profile and promote its work in raising standards
- Raise awareness of NETs across HCPs
- Develop links and joint meetings with other professional societies
- Improve the website
- Increase the society's involvement in regional meetings
- Help increase membership
- Mobilise public opinion
- Improve communications with membership and the wider fields via appropriate channels, including social media

Research

- Advise the UKI NETS Executive Committee on issues and policies regarding NETS research
- Maintain an overview of current and future NETS clinical studies and trials and help maximise recruitment
- Encourage and support the integration of translational research alongside clinical studies and trials
- Endorse UKI NETS- and Neuroendocrine Cancer UK-funded research
- Co-ordinate the UKI NETS Research Grants programme, including liaison with the Neuroendocrine Cancer UK
- Develop the programme for the Translational/Basic Science session at the Annual Meeting
- Raise the profile of NET research, including engaging with funding bodies
- Disseminate information about research funding, UKI NETS-funded research outcomes and availability of trials to the UKI NETS membership
- Link to the National Cancer Research Institute (NCRI) NET Sub-Group with respect to the ongoing portfolio of clinical studies, and strengthen links where possible

Education & Training

- Build on existing curriculum analysis carried out by the committee to further define and meet learning needs of UKINETS members
- Review applications for co-badging of existing relevant educational meetings (central or regional) and encourage use of the policy among the membership
- Manage and further develop annual NETs Basics training day



- Work with allied organisations such as Neuroendocrine Cancer UK and ENETS to develop educational resources, ensure that there is no duplication and that the UK remains an integral part of strategies for NET education and training in Europe
- Contribute to GP education
- Contribute to nurse education
- Design and undertake other education and training projects as relevant

Clinical Practice

- Advise the UKI NETS Executive Committee on issues and policies regarding NETS clinical practice
- Develop and maintain UKI NETS' clinical strategy
- Maintain an overview of current clinical practice and undertake projects to maintain and improve standards in the various disciplines involved in neuroendocrine tumours, in particular, developing a library of bitesize guidelines for the website
- Promote ENETS Centres of Excellence
- Compile and maintain a list of drugs/therapeutic agents (including agents/drugs used for investigation) relevant to NETs in the UK
- Disseminate information about clinical practice to the UKI NETS membership and raise the profile of NETS clinical practice
